III. NATURE OF THE ALLEGED VIOLATION:

The specific nature of the alleged violation is a Post Card mailed to 399,819 households of registered voters within the NHMCCD district. This constitutes 399,819 separate complaints as I was advised that since all are identical, that this one form will act as a "multiple COMPLAINT." This multiple "COMPLAINT" is further filed separately and individually against each respondent. This post card makes a political statement of: "If authorized, the bonds will require NO INCREASE IN THE TAX RATE." The statement is "qualitative" in that in no place in the ORDER calling for the election and issuance of the bonds is such a statement or quantitative fact or figure given. The ORDER in total contradiction states that the Debt service rate can go as high as \$.50 per 100 dollars of assessed valuation and not to exceed a total tax rate of \$.80 per \$100.00 of assessed valuation for a period of up to 40 years. To deceptively say or make a statement as a fact that there will be no TAX RATE INCREASE is a false premise when no such promise is contained in the ORDER, and the ORDER speaks the opposite. The "Statement and Thrust" of the "Post Card" is political in nature and not factual, when the facts are to the contrary.

Further statement on the "address" side of the post card go on to make more qualitative statements to the effect of making a hypothetical projections such as the following:

1.current and future student enrollment,.....
2. ...serve local hospitals and emergence service providers....
3. ...programs to support local business and industry....
4. ...improve current security and information technology....

The above statements make “icing on a cake” and are inducements to vote for the bonds. People typically want all good things and are influenced by painting this as all positive, when it is unknown quality issue statements, and not statements of facts that are contained within the bond order. There is no language that speaks in the bonds that they will benefit for the current and future students, what if the spending is on all of the wrong things? To state that the bonds will once again serve local hospitals and emergence service providers is once again a favorable judgement call and is “qualitative” and does not speak to any facts contained within the Election Order.

On the Post Card the words of “construction bonds” are mentioned as the sole description, yet a judgmental or qualitative description is stated as programs to support local business and industry; and the same argument is seen with the “improve current security and information technology” statement. It too is a qualitative and judgmental political statement as there is nothing of factual statement in the Election order calling for the bonds that is speaking to these facts as stated.

I see no problem with the non-address side of the post card other than the statement of the word “Convenient” falls into a judgmental description. Many people found that there was little convenience in finding the campuses and parking was very difficult. Once again this Post Card is “spinning” an opinion and definitely not FACTS, as was the experience of many people.

It is believed that Jurisdiction of the Texas Ethics Commission is covered under these violations under Title 15 of the Election Code of Political advertising or in or amongst other covered statutes of which the Commission has Jurisdiction.

IV. STATEMENT OF FACTS:

The Facts in these complaints are as follows:

1. On or about February 7, 2006 Respondent Marilyn Fisher ordered Election boundary maps of Montgomery County from Montgomery County in the cost of \$8.00
2. On or about January 30, 2006 Respondent Judy Stubblefield order voter data from Montgomery County
3. On or about April 19, 2006 Respondent Charles Kolh requested the first postage check for the US Post office. Note that this was long before I have ever sent out any mailings. The date on the final file that went to them was on April 25, 2006. Mailed on the 26th. The second comparison page was sent to them on May 2, 2006 and mailed the same day. Second Postage Check was requested on May 3, 2006
4. According to an interview by Mr. Brandon Moeller of the Tomball Poruteri Newspaper, Mr. Pickleman is quoted as stating that they (district) were countering my flyers that were being mailed out that stated that there would be a tax rate increase.
5. It is uncertain who within the NHMCCD placed the order for National Mail Advertising, Inc. Sales order # 210282 in the amount of \$17,405.25, however this invoice copy was contained in a “Public Information Act Request” from the NHMCCD.
6. Respondent Pickleman admits in an interview in July that appears in “The Potpourri” Newspaper (8-9-2006) that the Post Card was in response to two political mailings I had made. In direct defense of the Post Card to counter claims that I stated that there would be a tax and tuition increase. I MADE NO SUCH CLAIMS, as evidenced in the attached flyers that Pickleman claims he is responding to; this further indicates the intent and direction of “advocacy” of a political position taken in the Post Cards.
7. Respondents, Wright, Gilliam are also quoted as contributing to the position on the Post Card. Byas approved it, and yet it is not in the three languages as required under Federal guide lines, make a further indication that their intent was to reach the voting public that I was advertising to.
8. There is ample evidence as listed in the documents that all parties to this complaint were well aware, approved of the actions and or took no steps to thwart the actions of those that did this and created this Post Card. You can see that a copy of the laws, rules and warnings came themselves from many of the respondents in this complaint.
9. The total expenditure of funds exceeds that which is allowable without board approval and as of this date the Board has done nothing towards the firing, punishment or reprimand of any of those that planned, organized or controlled this action, including the head of the External affairs department, Mr. Laughter. The Open Records information in itself is incomplete in the questions asked as to whom authorized, approved, placed the order and other actions that led to the completion of the Post Cards. The postage exceeds the \$25,000 limit without board approval and yet this board has taken no actions whatsoever on this matter and they are very aware of the actions and have defended them.
10. There is clear evidence that all parties involved, by email on numerous occasions, did either send or sent and received the documents listed as #7 and #10 and were fully aware, yet chose to try to “slip it by.”

District receives another election

A candidate for the local college district's board of trustees said he will challenge the legality of a taxpayer-funded postcard mailed to every registered voter household within the district days prior to the May bond election.

NHMCCD board candidate Fred Blanton said the district's postcard was illegally mailed at taxpayer expense, because of the card's claim that the \$249.6 bond initiative would result in no increase in taxes.

"The statement that the tax rate will not increase is a qualitative statement and is a blatant electioneering statement," Blanton said. "It is not a statement of fact because of the simple provision in the election order language that states that the tax (debt service) rate can go to \$.50 per \$100 property valuation. That is an irrefutable fact that agrees with the order calling for the election and is also contained in the ballot language."

According to a Texas Ethics Commission pamphlet that explains the state's political advertising law, a taxing entity "can not spend or authorize the spending of public funding for political advertising."

"Political advertising is a communication that advocates a particular outcome in an election," the pamphlet reads. "This section does not apply to a communication that factually describes the purposes of a measure if the communication does not advocate passage or defeat of the measure."

Though local district attorneys have not filed charges against those responsible for the postcard's mailing at the college district, Blanton vows to file a complaint with the Texas Ethics Commission, which can make decisions regarding Texas election law, including the political advertisement law. Violating the law is a Class A misdemeanor.

A spokesperson for the Justice Department - though declining to comment specifically about the NHMCCD postcard - told The Potpourri that a taxing entity such as the NHMCCD would have to provide all voter information in three languages to Harris County voters and in two languages to Montgomery County residents.

"Section 203 of the Voting Rights Act requires that all election information provided in English by this District must be provided in the applicable minority language as well - Spanish in Montgomery and Spanish and Vietnamese in Harris - to all of those who depend on those languages," said Andrew Ames, a spokesperson in the Justice Department's office of public affairs.

District officials appear to have originally tried to mail the postcard on or around April 25, but the postcard stayed at the post office for more than a week until district officials paid more money for postage.

According to records obtained by Blanton under the Texas Open Records Act, there are two district check requisition forms on file at the district for postage fees to the North Houston Post Office at 4600 Aldine Bender.

On **April 19**, a district employee requested a NHMCCD check made out to the post office for **\$21,450** for "postage estimate from National Mail." National Mail was the company that printed the post cards and processed the mailing information, at a combined cost of **\$17,405.25**, according to the records.

About a week later, the same district employee requested another NHMCCD check in the amount of **\$14,918.43** to pay for the balance of the postage bill. Many residents received the cards when only two early voting days remained and some were received after early voting ended.

NHMCCD Chancellor John Pickelman said the district's mailing was in response to two political advertisement mailings sent to a sampling of local voters by Blanton's campaign. Pickelman and other district officials defended the district's mailing of the postcards to 399,819 homes at a cost of less than \$54,000, mostly for postage, according to district records obtained by Blanton. Pickelman said the mailing was not illegal and its statements are "factual."

"If there was an increase in the tax rate, we'd have to put that in there," Pickelman said. "There is no expressed advocacy in that piece. It was in

response to his (Blanton's) flyer that stated there would be a tax increase and a raise in tuition. We felt we had to get the truth out."

Blanton said the chancellor's claims about his flyer were incorrect, and he provided a copy to The Potpourri. The flyer doesn't allege the district is planning to raise tuition to help pay for the bonds, but states Blanton and two other candidates are committed to keeping "tuition affordable."

In one Blanton mailing, which contained a mail-in election ballot for residents more than 65 years old, Blanton's campaign claimed that a vote against the bond issue and a vote for Blanton and two other candidates were votes to "prevent another tax increase." "NHMCCD has hiked the tax rate a whopping 15 percent since 2002; the appraised tax base has increased another 19 percent," the flyer reads. "It's the highest rate increases on the Harris County tax statement." Blanton's mailing does not specifically say the bond election would cause a tax increase, but it does say the "hidden election" had been "hijacked to the campuses only." Blanton told The Potpourri that the district's trustees might have to increase taxes in a future year if the "recent trend" of the Texas Legislature decreasing money for higher education continues.

"We feel we should have equal access and funding to state the facts of the bond issue, which can cause the tax rate to be raised to 50 cents and a maximum total of 80 cents if necessary to repay the indebtedness, as called for in the election order," Blanton said. "It's like signing a blank bank note with a variable interest rate for up to 40 years. We demand that we should have a mailing sent out with the exact wording of the election order and in the three languages as required by the Voting Rights Act."

But NHMCCD officials disagree. Stating that the mailing was "their responsibility to inform" their constituents and that the postcard's language was within the confines of Texas election law, district officials defended the mailing of the postcards.

"I don't see an alternative to informing people," NHMCCD spokesperson Kathy Wright said. "I see it as a responsibility to tell people what we're doing and why we're doing it. I think every statement (on the postcard) is a statement of fact."

NHMCCD Chief Financial Officer Cynthia Gilliam said the district is planning to structure the bonds over 20 years without affecting the tax rate.

"When we sell bonds, the plan is for paying them off over 20 years," Gilliam said. "We structure it in a way so that we can add more debt without changing the tax rate. Fifty percent of the bonds are paid off within the first few years after the sale, and in that way, we can add more in later years."

Wright said many political subdivisions across the state inform voters about ballot issues through the use of postcards, and that the policy at the college district is "very open information."

"There's a lot of external expertise applied to this statement (of no tax increase) and no one qualified has said it is not true," Wright said.

Ten days before the May 13 election day, the North Harris Montgomery County Community College District mailed a postcard to every household with a registered voter in the district, which announced the election dates and the district's plan for using \$249.6 million in bonds for improvements at various campuses around the district.

The postcard, mailed on or around May 3 and received in mailboxes across the district within a few days, displayed the dates and times for early voting and election day voting, but directed citizens to a Web site or a phone number where they could find polling locations for election day.

For early voting, the postcard did read, "convenient early voting at any NHMCCD college or satellite center," but when many residents received the cards, there were only two days of early voting left.

The district's new polling locations for election day, established at each of the campuses, was criticized by the League of United Latin-American Voters because among its provisions, Montgomery County residents in Decker Prairie and Pinchurst would have had to cast their vote 20 miles away at the Montgomery College in Conroe instead of a couple of miles down the road at the Tomball College campus.

About a week after mailing the postcard, the district's leaders voted to cancel the election after the U.S. Department of Justice's Civil Rights Division objected to its plan to reduce the number of polling locations from 84 to 12. District officials have said the district was unable to organize the election including the hiring of 250 election judges - in a week's time. The Justice Department's objections to the change in the polling locations was faxed to NHMCCD administrative offices a week before election day.

Two weeks ago, the Justice Department announced a settlement of a lawsuit it had filed against the college district. According to the settlement, the college district must hold the election in November at the 84 original polling locations.

PROHIBITED USE OF STATE RESOURCES FOR POLITICAL CAMPAIGNS

While each election conducted by NHMCCD is a matter of great importance to each of us as both residents and employees of this District, please keep in mind that as employees of an agency of the State of Texas, all NHMCCD employees are prohibited from using state resources and state time to conduct political activities or engage in political advertising.

To ensure that each employee understands the limitations of conducting political activity or advertising, this short question and answer document has been prepared.

Is NHMCCD considered a state agency?

Yes. Section 556.001 of the Texas Government Code, which governs the conduct of public entities and agencies in political campaigns, includes “a university system or an institution of higher education” as defined by the Education Code, as a state agency for purposes of political activity. Therefore, because NHMCCD is an institution of higher education, we are considered a state agency of Texas.

What is considered “political activity” and “political advertising”?

Any time a person advocates (promotes) or opposes a political candidate or issue, he or she is engaging in political activity. If a person provides a written or broadcast communication that promotes or opposes a particular outcome in an election, he or she is engaged in political advertising. However, if a person is only supplying *factual* information about a candidate or issue, then this is not considered political activity or advertising. For instance, if you are telling someone the dollar amount of the bond issue, handing out a pamphlet that lists the candidates on the ballot, or explains where bond money will be spent, you are NOT engaging in political activity or advertising. But, be careful that the information is factual information that can be verified by another outside source. Also, be careful that you are not expressing an opinion as to the advantages or disadvantages of a particular issue or candidate along with the factual information. In that instance, you WOULD be engaging in political activity or advertising. Even a slogan that states, “ Show That You Care About Our Future.” is considered political activity.

What items are considered “state resources”?

Any item or thing of value owned or paid for by NHMCCD is considered a state resource. This includes any type of supplies, copiers, the internal mailing or email system, NHMCCD vehicles, or funds under NHMCCD control. None of these items may be used to advocate or oppose a political candidate or issue. If an employee chooses to engage in political activity, he or she must use his or her own resources to do so.

What is considered “state time”?

Anytime you are “on the clock” for your designated work hours at your NHMCCD location, you are prohibited from engaging in political activities. For instance, if you are at work between 7:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, you are prohibited from engaging in political conduct. Nor can a supervisor authorize or use an employee to engage in political activities during his or her work hours. If an employee chooses to engage in political activity, he or she must use his or her vacation or personal leave time to conduct the activities.

What happens if I engage in political activity or advertising while at my job or if I use NHMCCD-owned property to conduct political activity?

Violation of this law is considered a **Class A misdemeanor**, subject to criminal prosecution. Additionally the Texas Ethics Commission may levy fines against a person for violation of the

law. Finally, you may be subject to disciplinary action by NHMCCD, up to and including termination, for engaging in this conduct.

A Short Guide To the Prohibition Against Using Political Subdivision Resources For Political Advertising in Connection with an Election

Revised September 1, 2003

No matter how enthusiastic you are about an election, it is important to remember that the Texas Election Code prohibits the use of political subdivision resources to produce or distribute political advertising in connection with an election. Section 255.003 of the Election Code provides as follows:

- (a) An officer or employee of a political subdivision may not spend or authorize the spending of public funds for political advertising.
- (b) This section does not apply to a communication that factually describes the purposes of a measure if the communication does not advocate passage or defeat of the measure.
- (c) A person who violates this section commits an offense. An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor.

To understand the practical significance of this prohibition, it is useful to look at some of the specific words and phrases used in the law.

- **"Political advertising"** is a communication that advocates a particular outcome in an election. It can be a communication in almost any written or broadcast form, such as a billboard, a flier, a newsletter, a poster, a television or radio ad, or an Internet site.
- The prohibition applies to any **"officer or employee of a political subdivision."** In other words, if an officer or employee of a political subdivision makes a decision to use political subdivision resources in violation of the prohibition, the employee could be fined by the Ethics Commission or held criminally liable.
- The prohibition applies to **"spending or authorizing the spending of public funds"** for political advertising. Not only does this mean that the political subdivision may not purchase or authorize the purchase of new materials for use in creating political advertising, it also means that an officer or employee of a political subdivision would violate the prohibition by using existing paper and machinery to generate, display, or distribute political advertising.

Also, it is not permissible to use or authorize the use of the paid time of an employee of a political subdivision to create or distribute political advertising.

- The prohibition does not apply to **"a communication that factually describes the purposes"** of a measure election. In other words, it is permissible to use the resources of a political subdivision to produce explanatory material about what is at stake in a measure election. Violations of the law often occur, however, because someone finds it irresistible to wrap up a factual explanation with a motivational slogan such as:

IT PAYS TO INVEST IN THE FUTURE.

IT'S TIME TO MOVE AHEAD.

Another common misstep is to include "calls to action" such as:

LET'S BUILD A BETTER CITY.

or

SHOW THAT YOU CARE ABOUT OUR FUTURE.

Remember: No matter how much factual information about the purposes of a measure election is in a communication, *any amount* of advocacy is impermissible.

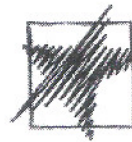
- A violation of the prohibition is a **Class A misdemeanor**. This means that a violation could lead to criminal prosecution. Also, the Ethics Commission has authority to impose fines for violations of section 255.003.

Another provision of the Texas Election Code prohibits an officer or employee of a political subdivision from using or authorizing the use of an internal mail system to distribute political advertising. An internal mail system is a system operated by a political subdivision to deliver written documents to its officers or employees. A violation of this prohibition could also lead to the imposition of fines by the Ethics Commission or to criminal prosecution.

Although you may not use political subdivision resources for political advertising, you are free to campaign for or against a proposition on your own time and with your own resources. If you do plan to become involved in a campaign, you should educate yourself about filing requirements and about the rules regarding disclosures on political advertising.

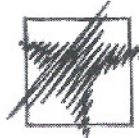

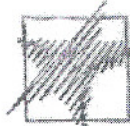

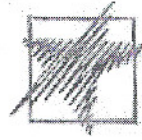

WHEREAS, under the laws governing the North Harris Montgomery Community College District (“District”), an election for Trustees to Position Nos. 1, 2 and 8, respectively, on the Board of Trustees of the North Harris Montgomery Community College District, shall be held on May 13, 2006, under the direction of the Chancellor of the District or his designee; AND

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees deems it necessary to call a Bond election.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordered by the Board of Trustees of the North Harris Montgomery Community College District that:

SECTION 1: An election shall be held within the District on May 13, 2006, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. for the purpose of electing Trustees to fill Position Nos.1, 2 and 8, respectively, of the Board of the District and authorizing a Bond election and that the Chairman and Secretary of the Board be authorized and directed to give notice of such election in the manner and for the time required by law. All of the duly qualified resident electors of the District shall be qualified to vote in said election.

SECTION 2: Any qualified voter desiring election for a position on such Board shall file with Ms. Judy Stubblefield as the agent for Ms. Maria Flotte O’Neill, the Secretary of the Board of Trustees, between February 11, 2006 and March 13, 2006 a completed application and filing fee of two-hundred dollars (\$200.00) or a petition with the signatures of two-hundred (200) registered voters of the North Harris Montgomery Community College District to have his or her name placed on the official ballot and the position number on such Board for which he or she desires to become a candidate.

No candidate shall be eligible to have his or her name placed on the official ballot under more than one position to be filled at such election. All candidates for Trustee in such election shall be voted upon and elected separately for positions on said Board, and all candidates shall be designated on the official ballot according to the number of such position to which they may seek election.

No person shall have a vote counted for him or her as a write-in candidate unless that person has filed a written declaration of write-in candidacy with Judy Stubblefield, Assistant to the Chancellor, by 5:00 p.m. on March 20, 2006 at the North Harris Montgomery Community College District Services and Training Center.

In the event that there is only one candidate for election to each position at the close of the declaration of write-in candidacy deadline at 5:00 p.m. on March 20, 2006, Ms. Maria Flotte O’Neill, Board of Trustees Secretary, shall certify in writing that all candidates are unopposed for election. The certification shall be delivered to the Board of Trustees as soon as possible and the Board, in accordance with Texas Open Meeting requirements, shall declare each unopposed candidate elected to office.

SECTION 3: At said election the following PROPOSITION shall be submitted in accordance with law:

PROPOSITION

SHALL THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF NORTH HARRIS MONTGOMERY COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT (THE "DISTRICT") BE AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE AND SELL AT ANY PRICE OR PRICES THE BONDS OF THE DISTRICT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$237,600,000 FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND EQUIPMENT OF SCHOOL BUILDINGS IN THE DISTRICT AND THE PURCHASE OF THE NECESSARY SITES THEREFORE, WHICH BONDS MAY BE ISSUED IN VARIOUS ISSUES OR SERIES, SHALL MATURE SERIALLY

OR OTHERWISE NOT MORE THAN 40 YEARS FROM THEIR DATE, AND SHALL BEAR INTEREST AT SUCH RATE OR RATES, NOT TO EXCEED THE MAXIMUM RATE NOW OR HEREAFTER AUTHORIZED BY LAW, AS SHALL BE DETERMINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE DISTRICT WITHIN THE DISCRETION OF THE BOARD AT THE TIME OF ISSUANCE; AND SHALL THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES BE AUTHORIZED TO LEVY AND PLEDGE, AND CAUSE TO BE ASSESSED AND COLLECTED, ANNUAL AD VALOREM TAXES ON ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY IN THE DISTRICT SUFFICIENT TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON SAID BONDS AS THE SAME COME DUE AND THE COSTS OF ANY CREDIT AGREEMENTS EXECUTED IN CONNECTION WITH THE BONDS, PROVIDED THAT THE AGGREGATE BOND TAXES IN THE DISTRICT SHALL NOT EXCEED \$0.50 ON THE \$100 VALUATION OF TAXABLE PROPERTY AND PROVIDED THAT THE AMOUNT OF BOND TAX TOGETHER WITH THE AMOUNT OF MAINTENANCE TAX SHALL NOT EXCEED \$0.80 ON THE \$100 VALUATION OF TAXABLE PROPERTY; SAID BONDS TO BE ISSUED AND SAID TAXES TO BE LEVIED, PLEDGED, ASSESSED, AND COLLECTED UNDER THE CONSTITUTION AND LAWS OF THE STATE OF TEXAS INCLUDING THE TEXAS EDUCATION CODE?

Section 4: The official ballot shall have printed on it:

At such election each qualified voter shall not vote for more than one (1) candidate for each position and shall vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the aforesaid PROPOSITION.

Section 7: This Order shall constitute the election order for the call of the election and the same or a substantial copy thereof shall constitute the notice of such election; and the Secretary of the Board is ordered to cause notice of the election to be given as required by law. Immediately after the election, the officers holding the election shall convey returns of the results to the Board of the District. The Board shall canvass such returns, declare the results of such election, and issue certificates of election to the persons shown by such returns to be elected to each of the three (3) named positions.

Notice of such election shall be given by publishing a substantial copy of this election order, in English, Spanish and Vietnamese, one time, not earlier than the thirtieth day nor later than the tenth day prior to the date set for the election, in a newspaper published in the District, and by posting a copy of this order on the bulletin board used for posting notices of Board of Trustees meetings and the District’s web page, not later than the 21st day prior to the date set for the election.

Said election shall be held in accordance with the Texas Election Code, except as modified by the Texas Education Code and the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended.

Amendment to Highen# at April 2006 Meeting

2. Consideration of Approval of the Order Calling Trustee and Bond Election and to Appoint a Staff Agent for the Board Secretary to Perform the Election Duties (ACTION ITEM 2): Dr. Pickelman reported the recommendations being presented to the Board regarding the Bond election are based on a nine month study. The Master Planning project was a professional, inclusive and thorough examination of two things. First was an assessment of the District's current facilities, making sure that in the future we did not get into a spiral of deferred maintenance. Second was a study to determine future facility needs to accommodate increased student enrollment and new programs. Faculty and staff were involved in identifying the needs of the District. Space utilization studies were conducted, enrollment projections were developed based upon population growth and recommendations were made. It was important to involve the community; therefore, the District conducted seven community advisory groups representing each of the colleges, a district-wide advisory group and the District's ISD superintendents and their board of trustees to present the proposed plan. Input from the groups included increasing the \$6.5 million for contingency costs in anticipation of rising construction cost. Community leaders in Kingwood felt there were some unmet needs in the area of the performing arts facility, which was not in the recommendation because it was part of Phase II. Kingwood's theater capacity is approximately 175 and restricts the offering of cultural events and in holding events such as a pinning ceremony for graduating nurses. There was very positive feedback on the financials, especially because the District was able to structure the financing of this bond referendum without an increase in the debt service tax rate. The amount recommended in the agenda was \$237.6 million, but on the basis of the feedback that was received from the groups, Dr. Pickelman proposed for the Board's consideration that the Kingwood College theater project be moved from Phase II to Phase I. The projected cost will be \$9 million, increasing Kingwood College's total estimated costs to \$35.5 million. In addition, Dr. Pickelman recommended that an increase in the contingency be considered in the amount of \$3 million for a total of \$9.5 million. This would require an increase to the total authorization from \$237.6 million to \$249.6 million. Dr. Pickelman stated that the District has been assured by our financial advisors that, with the structuring of the debt, there would be no increase in the debt service tax rate over the life of the bonds to add the additional \$12 million.

Dr. Campbell, Mr. Fox, Mr. Bates and Mr. Vogt reported on the feedback from the community advisory meetings in which they participated.

Mr. Vogt made a motion to amend the election order calling for the Trustee and Bond Election by increasing the amount of the proposed bond authorization from \$237.6 million to \$249.6 million. Mr. Bates seconded the motion and the Board unanimously adopted the amendment to the order calling for the Trustee and Bond Election which will add an additional \$12 million to the referendum including \$3 million added to the contingency costs and \$9 million added to move the Kingwood College theater project from Phase II to Phase I.

Dr. Campbell then made a motion to approve the amended election order and after a second to the motion by Ms. Marquard, the Board unanimously approved the order
